



Functional Screen Information Access (FSIA) Update Summary

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) updated FSIA on August 29, 2023. Below is a summary of the changes and how they will impact the screening process. If you have any questions or unexpected outcomes, please contact your screen liaison.

New Diagnosis Codes

DHS added two new diagnosis codes to the E-Brain/Central Nervous System, E8-Memory Loss by Provider, and E9-Memory Loss by Screening.

If the diagnosis of memory loss was from a health care provider, and is not due to ADD, ADHD, Mental Illness, Behavioral Diagnoses, Emotional Disturbances, Learning Disability, or Substance Use the screener will select E8.

If the diagnosis of memory loss was from a health care provider, and is due to ADD, ADHD, Mental Illness, Behavioral Diagnoses, Emotional Disturbances, Learning Disability, or Substance Use the screener will code according to cause.

If the Animal Naming Tool is administered and the score is less than 14 **and** the Mini-cog is administered with results of 0, 1, or 2, screeners will select E9, Memory Loss by Screening. There will be a text box in which screeners should note the date of the screening and scores.

As of August 29, 2023, screeners should no longer be selecting memory loss as K5.

Updates to Adaptive Equipment

Durable Medical Equipment (DME) or Adaptive Equipment for Bathing, Mobility, Toileting will be simplified, and DME for Transferring will not be changing.

The first time a screen is opened after the updates, whether an edit, or rescreen, DME information will be cleared out (regardless of what is being edited). Screeners will need to review the DME information and select the appropriate adaptive equipment.

There will only be one selection for adaptive equipment for Bathing. Adaptive equipment under Bathing will include Grab bar(s), Shower bed, gurney, trolley, shower chair, bathtub bench (including built-in seating), and Mechanical lifts.
